Reflecting on what to share today, I keep coming back to Psalm 61(62), which appears on the 8th Sunday of ordinary time, Year A. It's a beautiful bit of text I set a few years ago and I've loved it ever since. It became the title track of the first EP I recorded without Mike Stanley. When I set it, I wondered why I hadn't really noticed it before and it's because it gets lost in the transition into Lent. It is very apt now.

Let it serve as a reminder to us as the weeks draw on and we get a little virus-weary that we can lean into the Lord and He will be our rest in these days when all else is turmoil.
