In the tradition of the church this day is when we recall the institution of the Eucharist. Earlier in the day we had the Chrism mass, so we're recalling not just the institution of the Eucharist, but really the institution of priesthood. Our priests rededicate themselves to that precious service being in persona Christi for us, especially in the celebration of the Eucharist.

They've been faithfully doing that without us being there with them to celebrate over these past couple of weeks. This evening, as we begin the great three days of remembering, there will be weary priests faithfully celebrating alone the breaking of the bread, our memorial of the Lord's supper so beautifully captured in our second reading for the day.

So however you celebrate Triduum tonight, we are remembering together. In the breaking of the bread, we remember the one whose body is broken for us all.

On the night before He died He took the bread in His holy hands blessed the bread and broke it and gave it to His friends, as he said

Do this in memory of me, this is my Body, given for you. Do this in memory of me, take it and eat it, Remember me:Remember me.

On the night before He died He took the cup that was filled with wine gave thanks to His Father and gave it to His friends, as he said Do this in memory of me, this is my Blood, poured out for you. Do this in memory of me, take it and drink it, Remember me:Remember me.

So each time we eat this bread and every time we drink this proclaim your death Lord Jesus until you come again, for you said
